WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS:

NICHOLLS welcomed the committee and attendees introduced themselves.

REVIEW & APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

NO Approval of agenda – quorum not met.

REVIEW & APPROVAL OF NOVEMBER MINUTES:

PRESENTATIONS:

- SHANAHAN/BAUER gave a presentation on the Campus Mobility Plan outlining the movement to address ongoing initiatives and specific challenges across campus. Committee is reaching out to the AUTTC to provide perspective/identification on parking challenges and to help incorporate ways in which they can be productive in reaching out to stakeholders.

DISCUSSION:

- PRUSH highlighted on the Moped Improvement Plan; noting that the largest issues at hand are failure to register and illegal parking. With the AUTTC approval, the Parking Department would like to begin the communication/marketing process to implement the new suggested moped registration (\$50), regulations, and to work with IPF in converting suggested parking areas to designated moped “only” parking spaces/areas.
 - PRUSH asked for a motion of support to proceed as a “work in progress” until next month’s quorum.
- CERBIN spoke on the drafted letter of support to MSU Sustainability/Be Spartan Green Student Project Fund in hopes of receiving a \$5000 grant to help improve cycling safety and to obtain bicycle head/tail light sets to be distributed across campus. Additional support is also needed from the AUTTC, Police Dept., MSU Bike Shop and other groups across campus to help educate the bicycle community.

CORRESPONDENCE & PUBLIC COMMENT:

- PRUSH noted on a web submission of several bicycles needing to be impounded; request has been forwarded to the impound crew.
- PRUSH stated a web complaint concerning the dangers of event pedestrian traffic crossing at the Breslin Center at Harrison Rd/Ramp 7 during inclement weather. Submission has been forwarded to the Special Events Division.
- POTTER noted that this was his submission and suggested a new pedestrian crossing signal to be installed.
 - PRUSH stated that this would fall under the City of East Lansing jurisdiction.
- POTTER requested that the pedestrian roadway flip signs be diploid during winter months when snowplows are not running.
- POTTER requested that the AUTTC website (data page) be updated to reflect additional data that would include pedestrian/bicycle/moped related injuries to the crash data report.
- POTTER suggested enhancements made to the “Move Safe” website. Providing a link for public feedback/ideas.
