WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS:

PRUSH welcomed the committee.

ROUNDTABLE INTRODUCTION & DISCUSSION ITEMS:

a. Department of Police and Public Safety (John Prush)

PRUSH updated committee on the Wilson Road extension; with the ribbon cutting set for Tuesday, November 20th.

PRUSH noted that Stephanie O'Donnell (Traffic Engineer) is working with Ingham County on the traffic lights on Hagadorn Road (around the Wilson Rd extension) coordinating intersection signals with the railroad tracks.

PRUSH noted the ongoing installation of surface locking rings for moped parking. Resident Hall spaces have been implemented and will now begin installing campus wide with weather permitting.

PRUSH highlighted on the Mobility Meeting Day hosted by Exec. VP Udpa's Office and Government Affairs. Several outlets of media were invited to observe all that MSU is doing towards mobility.

b. Council of Graduate Students/COGS (Carissa Sorenson)

No updates/feedback to report.

c. Associated Students of MSU/ASMSU (Matthew Apostle)

APOSTLE questioned how the Bird scooters will transition into spring semester and how they handle/operate in snow.

PRUSH stated we should see a migration back to warmer destinations. Also, noted that Lime is working on a better design to be more weather capable.

d. Clerical-Technical Union/CTU (Christopher Wayne)

e. MSU Mass Transit/CATA (Deborah Kirby)

f. APA/APSA Unions (Matt Winowiecki)

WINOWIECKI commented on his recent encounter with Kathy Bissett (Parking Office Coordinator); highlighting on his positive experience in resolving a possible bike impound.

g. IPF Planning, Design and Construction (Steve Troost)

TROOST noted the Wilson Road Extension ribbon cutting.

TROOST mentioned that the ECBFS (Exec. Committee on Building Facility & Space) did approve the use of the Spartan Community Center for the Autonomous Vehicle Program.

TROOST noted a 3.4 million gross square foot area of development for Spartan Village; University-based retirement village on the horizon.

TROOST mentioned the future Farm Lane bridge replacement; planning has begun with a possible start date in 2021.

CORRESPONDENCE & PUBLIC COMMENT:

PRUSH noted a web submission from a Mr. Pauley regarding moped parking in Lot 8; will review and work towards a solution.

PRUSH noted a correspondence from a Mrs. Proctor (Parent) on the number of moped spaces at Wilson/Holden Halls; will review and work towards a solution.

PRUSH noted a correspondence from a Mr. Rikey regarding WB Kalamazoo intersection signage (Right Turn Yield to Bicycles); complaint that sign in not in a desirable place. Will review and work towards a solution.

BROGNIART and BINKOWSKI shared moped concerns with lack of parking in and around Akers/Fee Halls, Main Library, Bessey Hall and North Campus. Also noted, were the concerns with the direction of angle parking and difficulty in some parking areas.

PRUSH stated that AUTTC will look at stated concerns and work to make improvements.
